

Kiwi Avoidance Training Event Site Induction

This KAT event site induction is to ensure all participants and visitors are aware of the hazards particular to this site and stay safe. On arrival, please read the potential hazards listed below, view the training site map (attached) and sign that you have understood.

Hazard/Risk	Management
1. Other dogs – dogs may become aggressive or fight with other dogs and/or people causing injury or death to dogs and/or people	Keep your dog(s) inside the vehicle until informed otherwise. Don't let your dog roam loose. Keep your dog under control at all times.
2. Weather – sun/hot or rain/cold conditions, hypo or hyperthermia	Weather conditions can change quickly – ensure you have suitable clothing for the conditions. Bring a sun hat and wear sunscreen if it's hot, and carry water and food. Have a break in some shade if needed. Carry raingear if it is wet or cold. Wear appropriate clothing and footwear.
3. Training course conditions – the course may be slippery after rain, there may also be hazards such as low branches/holes, blackberry or electric fences which could cause trips, slips, scratches or electric shock.	View course map attached which identifies the hazards specific to this site. Hazards are marked on the course with flagging tape. Wear appropriate footwear.
4. Bees or wasps – stings, swelling, anaphylactic shock	View course map attached – avoid areas where there are bees or wasps. Inform the trainer if you are allergic to bees or wasps. Carry any personal medication you may need to treat bee or wasp stings.
5. Car parking and traffic on the road	Ensure your vehicle is parked well off the road and is not a risk to other road users. Watch out for traffic if crossing the road. Ensure your dog(s) do not wander onto the road.
6. Predator control traps or bait stations – crushing, cuts, poisoning	Pesticides and traps may have been placed in the area. DO NOT HANDLE OR TOUCH any pesticides, traps or trap boxes.
